Tech Director's Report – Shawn Hanna

June 2024 Tech Director's Report

Every so often I am asked a complicated question about what oil to use in our Corvettes. So, again, I will try to answer the question(s) as simply as I can.

Let us talk about how you drive your car. If you are a cruiser who runs your Corvette at posted speeds and occasionally steps on the gas to pass or just for fun, I recommend you use the manufacturer recommended oil at the recommended weight. However, modern technologies favor using different oils for the older C1 through-C3 Corvettes. I recommend Amsoil Z-Rod 10W-30 for these years. It provides the best protection for a flat tappet cam which these cars

have from the factory. The C-4, C5 and C6 use Mobil 1 synthetic from the factory 5W-30 which I recommend. The C7 and C8 saw some technological advancement and Chevrolet used Mobil 1 0W-40. Remember, my choices are for cruisers and just my opinion.

Next month I will cover more aggressive driving and oil filters.

Hope some of you were lucky enough to attend the tour of Veit with the Tewes's.



National Corvette Museum – Update

New Exhibit

Celebrating 10 Years Of Progress Since The Infamous Sinkhole; "Ground To Sky: The Sinkhole Reimagined" To Open On Friday, June 14, 2024



BOWLING GREEN, KY, February 12, 2024 – On February 12, 2014, at 5:38 AM, the National Corvette Museum suffered a cave-in that claimed eight cars from the museum's multimillion dollar collection and caused an international sensation. The video and images captured by museum security cameras went viral, circulating around the globe. Viewers were left stunned at the loss of such rare and remarkable treasures, and all eyes were on the National Corvette Museum's response and recovery.

Today, on the tenth anniversary of the world-famous sinkhole, the National Corvette Museum is celebrating incredible change and growth in the decade since, revealing details on its upcoming exhibit "Ground to Sky: The Sinkhole Reimagined." The exhibit will open to the public on Friday, June 14, 2024, and will run through September 15, 2024. It will document the moments, memories, and machines that made history that fateful day, while focusing on the accomplishments of countless Museum staff and supporters who built back and reimagined a National Corvette Museum that continues to evolve.

"The National Corvette Museum captured the attention of the world a decade ago, and we've spent the last decade turning misfortunes into hard-fought and well-earned triumphs," said Kaye Wagner, National Corvette Museum Board Chair. "With over 15 major exhibitions, tens of millions of dollars in renovations and improvements, the creation of a STEAM-focused education gallery, the addition of a world-class Motorsports Park to our campus, and countless other advances in the last ten years, the National Corvette Museum is proud of our journey. Thanks to our amazing team and supporters, we have survived a sinkhole. Not only have we endured, but we are thriving." According to Wagner, "Like all museums, the National Corvette Museum rotates artifacts on and off exhibit to rest them and bring in fresh material for our visitors. Those who wish to see the sinkhole artifacts should make definitive plans to visit during the run of "Ground to Sky." Once the exhibit closes, these artifacts will be rotated back into the collection for rest from public view."

The exhibit will feature two Corvettes that were recovered from the sinkhole and fully restored, a 2009 "Blue Devil" ZR1 and the 1 Millionth Corvette (a white '92 model). It will also include other cars that remain damaged from the incident and dramatic multimedia that illustrates a look back at the National Corvette Museum's remarkable history, and a vision of where the Museum is heading.

Artifact of the Month



1995 Indianapolis Motor Speedway Commemorative Wine Glass

In 1995, Indianapolis Motor Speedway (IMS) was a racetrack in transition. The previous year, track President Tony George had announced plans to launch the Indy Racing League, a new oval-based series for American open-wheel racing centered on the Indianapolis 500. Additionally, NASCAR hosted the first Brickyard 400 in the summer of 1994, breaking a decades-long tradition of the Indy 500 as IMS' only annual race. NASCAR would return to Indianapolis for a second race in August 1995, but in May, the Brickyard was gearing up for the 79th Indy 500. A special two-toned purple and white Corvette paced the field, marking the third time that a Corvette had served as the Indy 500's official pace car.

The race is best remembered today for its controversial finish. During a restart with 11 laps to go, leader Scott Goodyear drove around the pace car while coming toward the green flag. Race officials assessed a stop-and-go penalty to Goodyear, who argued that the track safety lights

had turned green and that he was cleared to restart. Goodyear also thought that the pace car had been going too slowly, and the drivers behind him had nearly collided trying not to pass the pace car themselves. As a result, Goodyear's team instructed him to ignore the black flag and continue to race. With five laps to go, race officials stopped scoring Goodyear, making Jacques Villeneuve the leader. Villeneuve went on to win the race. Goodyear and his team considered protesting the penalty, but a review of video evidence revealed that the safety lights were still yellow when he passed the pace car.

The start of the second Brickyard 400, run on the first Saturday in August, was delayed by rain. Once the race got underway, it was slowed by only one caution flag. Dale Earnhardt captured the victory, earning Chevrolet a second win at Indianapolis following Jeff Gordon's victory in the inaugural event. Earnhardt won with an average speed of 155.206 miles per hour, still the second-fastest Brickyard 400 ever run.

Throughout its history, Indianapolis Motor Speedway has periodically released commemorative glassware honoring Indy 500 winners. This wine glass from 1995, however, signals the arrival of NASCAR at the Brickyard. It recognizes both Villeneuve and Earnhardt as the winner of IMS' two races, a turning point in the history of America's most storied speedway.


