Which Oil is Best

In my last report, I spoke to you regarding oils for our Corvettes. If you remember I said if you are a "cruiser" and not an aggressive driver you should go with the manufacturer's recommended lubricants.

This time, if you are an "aggressive" driver here is a YouTube video that breaks down many of the "Performance Lubricants" in a contest to see which holds up the best. Since we are looking at performance here, the tests do not take into consideration the prices of the oils. Cheap insurance in my book.

Personally, I use Amsoil in my racing car and it works very well for lubrication and heat protection. Occasionally, my oil temperature will reach around 275 degrees under challenging conditions. Amsoil has served me well.

There is a lot of information and consequently, contention regarding oil selection so you can judge for yourself after viewing the video.

National Corvette Museum Update



All roads lead to Bowling Green, Kentucky for the 30th Anniversary of the National Corvette Museum

This year attendees had a chance to view the new C8 ZR1. There were thousands of Corvettes from all over the world in attendance. Shawn and Jan Hanna will have much more to report for the October newsletter. They were the leaders from Minnesota.











Artifact of the Month

The creation of the National Corvette Museum was a true grassroots effort. Members of the National Corvette Restorers Society (NCRS) sought to create a technical library for preserving Corvette-related documents and literature. This idea blossomed into support for a museum, and the NCRS found valuable allies at Bowling Green Assembly and the city's Chamber of Commerce. The NCRS accepted the city's donation of about 33 acres of land along Interstate 65 near the Corvette plant. Bowling Green was on its way to becoming the center of the Corvette world.

Once the NCRS had their land for the museum, the next question was what kind of building to create. One suggestion was to shape the Museum like the Chevrolet bowtie, but this idea was scrapped when it became obvious that people would only recognize the design from overhead. Another possibility for the museum was a large, rectangular building that resembled an Incan temple. However, the idea that stuck was to create a building with a sleek, curving exterior and an industrial shine. The design represents speed, innovation, and performance, themes that characterize the history of the Corvette.

The most iconic feature of the National Corvette Museum building is the Skydome. Constructed in 1994 as part of the original Museum, the Skydome opened as the home of the "Corvette Salon" exhibit. Today, it still serves as a place for <u>exhibitions</u>, <u>receptions</u>, <u>and other special events</u>. As plans for the Museum came together, architects wanted to add something that looked

futuristic and easily recognizable. The Skydome's round shape complements the curvature of the museum building and even resembles the speedometer on a Corvette dashboard when viewed from overhead. Its bright yellow paint and dramatic height make the Museum easy to spot for travelers on I-65.

Despite its name, the Skydome is not technically a dome. The structure consists of a conical base with the top portion of the cone removed, creating a sloped surface. Architects refer to this type of shape as a frustum. A red spire pierces the Skydome through the top of the frustum, reaching 128 feet high. As a feature of the Museum's award-winning architecture, the Skydome captures the excitement that makes Corvette, America's Sports Car, known worldwide.

The story of the Original Vettes for Vets t-shirt

It all started at the Sovereign Estates Red, White and Blues festival with wine, friends, Mick Sterling and the Stud Brothers blues band, a question, a napkin, and a borrowed pen. The question was "What do you think about a t-shirt for Vettes for Vets?" The napkin became an impromptu sketch pad and the answer was a resounding Yeah, let's go for it. Little did we know what we didn't know. It was an all-out learning experience, culminating in selling out and donating our entire order of 100 t-shirts.

It was like starting up a small business, initial concept, design development, copyright issues, finding a manufacturer with design capability, quality of the shirt, sizing and style, cost vs design vs sales price, marketing, sales and finally distribution. It was a team effort all the way every day. We weren't satisfied with anything until everyone was in agreement.

For example. The guys were going to order all crew neck shirts but our wives insisted we have v-necks for the women. It was going to increase the cost but after a bit of mumbling we agreed and are glad we did. Women were delighted to have v-necks available.

We presented four design concepts to the board. We would have liked to use a flashier design but ran headlong into copyright and licensing issues. There's a lot of great artwork on the web but we learned that all creative work is copyright protected once it is created. We found artwork that could be used but at a significant licensing fee.

In fact, a copyright issue arose as we were ready to submit the order. Our club logo has a checkered flag and fleur-de-lis flags inside a circle. That design has been copyrighted since the creation of the first Corvette. The copyright compliance people at our printer would not allow us to use our logo as is. Within minutes the printer changed the fleur-de-lis to an American flag and we were off to production. As Barry was to find out, the American flag and checkered flag that is on the shirt was the original Corvette logo that was never used. See the link to the 70 year history of the Corvette logo.

In the end we gave 12 t-shirts to the Veterans Home at an in-kind value of \$137, donated another 9 shirts and sold 79 shirts at a profit of \$435 which will be given to the Veterans Home

Our thanks to AJ for giving us the go ahead before he even saw anything, to the board for encouraging us to order 100 shirts when we only had 45 pre-orders and to all of you who bought the shirts. We're already working on an exciting idea for next year.


